## Information for site workers



Construction of Pen y Cymoedd Wind Energy Project commenced in February 2014 and will run until early 2017, when we expect the wind farm to be fully operational. There will be a lot of construction activity onsite during this time period.

### Overview of the construction programme:

#### Construction programme:



**February 2014 – 2016:** Civil and electrical works, including construction of the site welfare compound, site access tracks, turbine foundations, crane pads, underground cabling and substation

↓ **Late 2015:** Turbine deliveries, civil works continue

↓ **Early 2016:** Turbine installation expected to begin

↓ **Late 2016:** The wind farm is commissioned

→ **Early 2017:** Project completion

### Wave hello, wave goodbye

# Pen y Cymoedd Wind Energy Project site rules

## Members of the public



Be aware that you may come across members of the public in any area in which you are working.

### CSCS Card and site induction

No individual can enter or work onsite without a CSCS card and site induction from JBBB or ABB.

### Speed limit

The onsite speed limit is 15mph. For all other site information please refer to the site rules given to you at your site induction.

### Members of the public

If you see a member of the public onsite, please be polite and courteous. Use the opportunity to make sure that they are aware of H&S guidance for site.

### The media

Should any media representatives attempt to enter the site please speak with them politely, directing them to our Wales press office number 02920 556 367.

### Walkers and mountain bikers

The entire area of Pen y Cymoedd Wind Farm is open to the public and is an area frequently used by walkers and mountain bikers. Clear signage is displayed onsite for information. A fact sheet is also available for download on our website and has been sent to members of the public known to use the site regularly. However, the area attracts a lot of visitors who may not be aware that we are working onsite.

### Wave hello, wave goodbye

If you see a member of the public wave hello when you see them so that they are aware that you know they are there and wave goodbye as they leave the area you are working in.

### Be aware

Although public rights of way are clearly marked not all users stick to these and may use their own routes through the forestry. Be aware that you may come across a member of the public in any area in which you are working.

### Members of the public take priority

Remember that members of the public have priority on all public rights of way and forest tracks.

### Non-site vehicles

The use of non-site vehicles such as motorbikes and quad bikes onsite is illegal and a common problem for Natural Resources Wales as landowners. If you witness any vehicles like this do not approach them but call the police non-emergency number 101 and report the incident.
